## Consumer Reports available on web

You can access Consumer Reports articles at home through the library's web connection.

Enter the following address in your browser: <http://www.libratyweb.org/databases>. Scroll down and select EBSCO MasterFile Select; enter your library card number and last name. Click on "Continue." Enter your subject where it says "Find," then enter Consumer Reports as the publication name. Click the search button. Articles can be accessed if you then select either PDF or HTML full text.


You can also browse by issue if you click the Publication tab. Enter Consumer Reports in the Browse Publications box. Click the publication name. Select your year and month. Please note there is a three month delay imposed by Consumer Reports. 

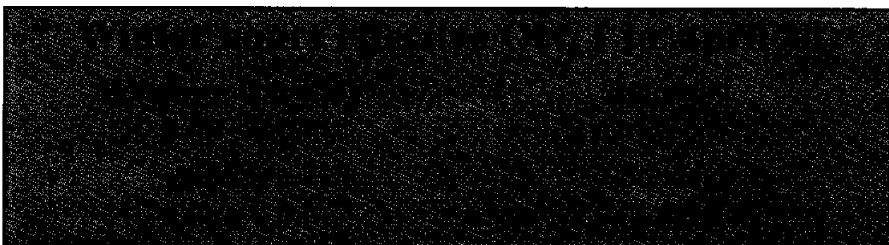
## Small-business workshops to focus on franchises, e-commerce, more

### **Library cards need annual updating**

Each year the circulation staff will update your library card and you will be asked to verify your address and telephone

number. As of Jan. 1, 2004, any fines or fees on a patron's card will need to be paid in full when the card is updated.

# Trustee election will take place in spring

There will be one library trustee position on the ballot in the School District election this spring.


The library board is comprised of five library trustees who serve five year terms. They attend monthly board meetings, currently held on the second Tuesday of each month. Trustees also serve on commit-

tees which hold additional separate meetings.

A candidate must be a qualified voter of the Fairport Central School District. This means that the candidate must be 1) a citizen of the United States 2) a resident of the District for at least one year prior to the election 3) at least 18 years of age and 4) must not be ineligible to

serve as provided by law.

Library trustees are responsible for the determination of library policy and the disbursement of library funds.

Trustees are expected to devote time and effort to the trusteeship, to be active advocates for the library and to be receptive to many opinions and suggestions. 

**Remember Your Library Card!**

New York State law protects the confidentiality of patron records. In order to comply with this law the library must require you to have your library card with you when you check out materials. This limits access to your patron record.

## Wireless Internet now available

With your own laptop and a wireless network card, you can now use the Internet in the library. Time Warner provides the RoadRunner connection and the Friends of the Fairport Public Library donated the funds
