### Learning Express

Another database with remote access is Learning Express. Go to [www.learningexpresslibrary.com](http://www.learningexpresslibrary.com).

Click on "New User" button.

If you are in the library, create a username and

password of your choice and then verify your password.

If you are accessing the site from home, enter "14450" and the last nine digits of your library card number as your username (ex. 14450234254345). Proceed with the practice exam or course of your choice.

When you return to the site, click on the "Returning User" button. Sign in using the SAME username and password that you first created.

Click on the MyAccount button at the top of the page. Then, click on the "Continue" button to work on an exam you started previously.

Since seating in the park is limited, most concertgoers bring lawn chairs or blankets. In case of rain, the concert will be cancelled.

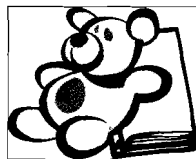

Each year the circulation staff will update your library card and you will be asked to verify your address and tele-

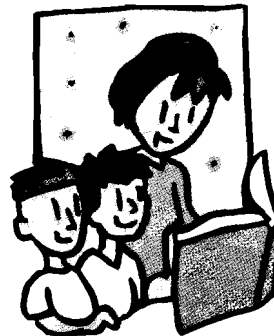
phone number. Any fines or fees on a patron's card will need to be paid in full when the card is updated. 📖

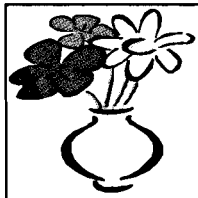

Community Center, just down the street from the library, at 92 South Main Street.

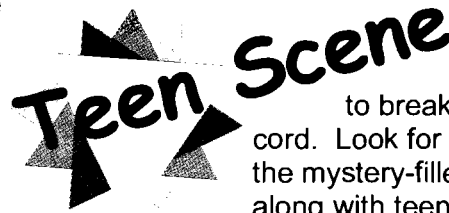
No fee is charged during the rest of the sale, which runs Friday, June 1<sup>st</sup> from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm, Saturday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. On Sunday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>, the sale runs from 12:00 pm to 3:00 pm and costs \$2 per bag -- as many books as you can fit -- our bag.


Each year the selection changes, but those who attend have their pick of a wide assortment of children's books, cookbooks, new releases, mysteries, history, classics, fiction, non-fiction, rare and out-of-print books, CDs, DVDs, and special editions.

A new Internet reservation and printing system was recently installed at the library. All Internet printing goes directly to the Circulation Desk now for payment before printing.

Printing from the Express Catalog workstations is still free and received at the Information Desk.

When all the Internet workstations are occupied, patrons

can now reserve the next available workstation at the Reservation Station, located behind the Information Desk.

By logging in your library number and last name, you will receive a receipt that indicates the workstation number and the time it will be available. For a demonstration or if you have any questions, please stop by the Information Desk.

## Library remembers Lois Tipton


Lois Tipton, adult services librarian at the Fairport Public Library, died on March 19th after a 2½ year struggle with ovarian cancer.

Lois had a varied library career, all of it within the Monroe County Library System (MCLS). In 1987, she started her library career at the Rochester Public Library as a part-time library assistant. After earning her Master of Library Science degree, she was hired as a full-time librarian and worked in a variety of departments, including the Literature Division and the MCLS Consultant's Office. In 2000, she began working at the Fairport Public Library. She managed the adult book collection, coordinated several book discussion groups, and passionately organized the first-ever Fairport Public Library Book Cart Drill Team, proudly marching in two parades.

Lois was married to Simon Pontin, host of the Sunshine Show on WXXI Radio. She was active in the community in a variety of ways including

as a tutor for Literacy Volunteers, a reader for Reachout Radio and a member of the Rochester Knitting Guild. She also adopted two greyhounds away from the racetracks.

After her diagnosis, Lois was an active member of Gilda's Club, educating other women on the hidden symptoms of ovarian cancer. She also spoke to medical students with her oncologist, to raise awareness of the disease within the medical profession.

She will be greatly missed by all those who knew her.
